The Burlington Fire Protection District is looking for team-oriented, community-focused, candidates to fill existing full-time vacancies for:

Firefighter-EMT or Firefighter-Paramedic

This hiring process will be used to fill any immediate openings and establish an eligibility list for future openings as needed.

For employment consideration with the District each candidate must possess:

- a. Proof of current KY EMT-B certification OR current KY EMT-P License
- b. Proof of IFSAC Firefighter I or KY 150-hour certification
- c. Proof of current CPAT certification or meet the KY requirements for CPAT waiver.

The preferred candidates will possess:

- a. Kentucky Fire Inspector or fire inspection certification from IFSAC or Pro-Board
- b. Previous experience as a career EMT or Paramedic
- c. IFSAC Firefighter II or KY 400-hour firefighter certification
- d. Advanced certifications including apparatus operator, instructor, critical care EMS, or technical certifications such as HAZMAT technician or technical rescue

Process to apply:

- a. Applications are available at the fire station during regular business hours or by appointment
- b. Submit a completed application and resume by Monday December 13, 2021 at 12 noon to the attention of Burlington Fire Chief Jeff Barlow, P.O. Box 479, Burlington, KY 41005
- c. Qualified applicants will be notified of the next steps in the process.
- d. Process concludes for selected candidates with a background check and pre-employment NFPA1582 medical evaluation.

Position:

- a. This position is a 24/48 work schedule and is a CERS-Hazardous duty firefighting position
- b. Hourly wage is \$14.84 \$19.35 depending upon qualifications (approx. \$49,700 \$64,800 annually)
- c. Medical insurance, dental insurance and short/long-term disability insurance provided
- d. Vacation, sick time, and longevity benefits provided
- e. The position is scheduled to start in February 2022, no later than February 27th

FEMA – SAFER Grant Notice

Three positions are funded by a FEMA-SAFER grant award #EMW-2020-FF-00105 for fire inspection and community risk reduction activity as well as staffing of front-line response apparatus. During the period of performance, individuals can anticipate fire prevention and risk reduction activities for 33% of the shift schedule, including but not limited to: fire inspections, pre-planning, and community education.
